Maatrutva Program

The Program educates pregnant women from underserved communities about health care during pregnancy thereby encouraging them to inculcate health seeking behaviour in them for safe deliveries



201 Pregnant women from under-served communities were registered this month to provide informative sessions



613 Sessions were conducted with registered women informing them about pre-natal care



20% Women registered were in their first Trimester



1499 Follow-Up calls were made to achieve 4847 outcomes

Outcome Assessment

We follow up with our beneficiaries on regular intervals to understand the outcome of services



100% Women have given colostrum to their new born baby



87% of the new born babies have been at or over 2.5 kgs which is considered to be healthy in infants



100% Women have been feeding their new born in every 2 hours





16% Women in the community have started using contraceptives post delivery





Assessment of Supplements Received from the Government

Follow up with registered pregnant women about the status of supplements received during the course of their pregnancy. The below data is out of **459** calls made this month










HB Level Analysis of women

22 Patients and caregivers were provided with an extended accommodation facility at Dr. Ernest Borges Memorial Home, Bandra



Case Story

Rakhi Singh, a determined woman from West Bengal, always had her eyes set on her dreams and her family's happiness. At 32 years old, she was juggling her job at a private company while managing her household with her husband, who worked as a driver. Life was sailing smoothly until a sudden turn of events in 2020 shifted the course of her life. It all started with a mysterious ailment that left Rakhi in despair. Despite months of medication, her condition only worsened, leading to the dreaded suggestion of surgery. Little did she know that this was just the beginning of a long and arduous journey awaiting her.



In February 2022, Rakhi's world crumbled when she was diagnosed with gynaecology cancer. The news shook her to the core, but amidst the turmoil, her husband stood by her like a rock, shouldering the responsibilities that now weighed heavily on his shoulders. With tears in her husband's eyes he said, "Rakhi commenced her chemotherapy in March 2022, where the battle against the disease began but, fate had more challenges in store for her. A paralytic brain stroke condition struck, confining her to a hospital bed for months." The situation tested not only Rakhi's strength but also her husband's unwavering support and resilience.

In January 2023, another blow hit Rakhi as she underwent a surgery to remove her ovary and uterus. The emotional turmoil was immense for the couple, but together, they faced each obstacle with courage and determination. The treatment continued, with months turning into a blur of medications, chemotherapy, and hospital visits. Amidst it all, a ray of hope emerged in the form of the GJK Foundation, whose support provided a glimmer of light in the darkness that had engulfed Rakhi's life. Financial struggles loomed large, threatening to derail Rakhi's treatment. However, the timely intervention of the GJK Foundation offered a lifeline, providing her with accommodation at Dr. Ernest Borges for three months. The Foundation's kindness not only eased their accommodation woes but also instilled a renewed sense of hope in Rakhi and her husband's life.

"I am extremely grateful for GJK Foundation's zero cost accommodation aid for needy cancer patients like us. Their support has made a real difference during a challenging time. The comfort and care provided by the foundation ensure that I can focus on Rakhi's recovery." Said her husband.
